#### **Time to Think Fly Control**

CCE has an online checklist to help you develop or evaluate an Integrated Pest Management ("IPM") plan for flies on your dairy:

Ask Roy Gilkinson, our Cattl-Tek route manager, about our support program using parasitic wasps. He is familiar with assessing the quantity needed and setting up a schedule for on-farm application.

We have a supply of baits, tapes and sprays in-stock.

#### Oh, No! Not Crypto Again!

With warmer weather we are going to be challenged by increased calf diarrhea caused by this parasite.

A background piece on "crypto" (cryptosporidium parvum) is available in the Calf Facts Resource section on our website. It includes (1) Exposure, (2) Control, (3) Normal recovery by calves and (4) People concerns.

Please remember persons working with calves if not previously exposed to crypto when the spring crypto surge occurs may have diarrhea for a few days.

#### **Bunker Safety**

Cornell Cooperative Extension NWNY Dairy team reminds us of the need for safety training including:

- If possible, have everyone on or around the bunk wear a safety vest.
- Remind everyone on the farm to be careful of increased truck traffic.
- Remind those operating packing tractors to wear their seat belt and pack the silage at a safe slope.
- Have a quick huddle with everyone before covering the bunk. Review the plan so everyone knows what their job is.
- Remind everyone to follow these safety practices:
  - **1.** No horseplay.
  - **2.** Stay away from the edges of the bunk as much as possible.
  - 3. Watch out for one another.

#### Field Work & Somatic Cell Counts

What? How is field work related to somatic cell counts? Spring field work commands a lot of attention and effort. It is easy to let our attention to parlor protocol compliance slip away in this busy time.

#### Remember:

- Quiet movement of cows into the holding area and parlor.
- Thorough and complete coverage of teats with predip.
- Adequate wait time before wiping, careful and complete wiping.
- Adequate wait time before unit attachment to allow oxytocin release.
- Thorough and complete coverage of teats with postdip.

It is possible to maintain a low somatic cell count even when the dairy is swamped with spring field work.
